CONCEPT NOTE

The Africa Globally Connected Religious Plurality Project based at the University of Munster, Germany in partnership with its research associates from the University of Birmingham, Osun State University, Ecole des Hautes Etudes en Sciences Sociales, University of Gaston Berger and Makerere University is a organizing a two day workshop on the role of social identities in inter-religious arrangements across Nigeria. The workshop is scheduled for 25-28 February 2025. The Africa Globally Connected research project is part of the "Religion and Politics Cluster of Excellence Network" (DFG Project Number: EXC 2060/1) at the University of Münster. It is a transcontinental and comparative research collaboration on the role of social identities in mediating Muslim-Christian-ATR relations in contemporary Africa and it is premised on the fact that religion is an engine of political and social change across the world.

Drawing on this research partnership, the central question, which the workshop seeks to address, is: How do social identities inform the ways in which Christians, Muslims and practitioners of African Traditional Religion assert, bridge and accommodate religious differences in Nigeria's plural religious settings?
